

Guidelines for Contributors to MedGG

General Requirements

One copy of the typescript should be submitted, together with a disk or CD-ROM containing the paper and any additional materials. As an alternative to the disk or CD-ROM, the paper and any additional materials can be sent as an e-mail 'attachment'. An MS Word for Windows[®] document or an RTF file are acceptable formats. The permitted languages are German and English only.

The required typescript must be letter-quality printed in Times New Roman font, 12 point, one and a half spaced with ample margins and should not exceed 10,000 words (including footnotes and bibliography) in length. A summary, not exceeding 150 words, should be appended to the typescript. Apart from the use of paragraphs, formatting should be avoided. All pages should be paginated. The Editor reserves the right to make stylistic emendations.

Please mark all quotations in your text. Insertions and omissions should be marked by squared brackets.

A statement giving the title of the paper, the name(s) of the author(s), the author(s)' present position(s), address(es), telephone and fax numbers and E-mail address(es) should be provided on a separate sheet.

Footnotes and annotations

Number footnotes in order, corresponding to the numbers in the text.

If a full sentence is quoted, footnote numbers should follow the closing punctuation. If the footnote refers to the preceding word, it should directly follow it.

Annotations which give credit to literature or any other material used refer to the attached bibliography:

For multiple works which have the same author(s) and publication date please add the first noun of the title:

Bibliography

The bibliography should be appended to the end of the paper. Please refer only to the sources mentioned in the footnotes and annotations. Please include the full names of all authors or editors where known and list them in alphabetical order.
